Scholarships are awarded on a 50% grant : 50% loan basis through a competitive application process once a year in June or July.

Who may apply: Those residing in Bangladesh, India, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Tajikistan, Kyrgystan, Syria, Egypt, Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Madagascar, Mozambique, Madagascar. Those living in France, Portugal, UK, USA and Canada are considered if originally from one of the previously-listed countries.

Dr. and Mrs. William Oliver Campbell Memorial Scholarship Fund

This fund is intended to provide scholarships to: (a) Christian, non-residents of the U.S. who desire to attend US educational institutions, and (b) Christian residents of the U.S., preferably African Americans who desire to pursue a higher education. The Rotary Peace Fellowship is for individuals with international peace and conflict resolution experience. Applicants must be proficient in English, have a strong commitment to peacebuilding, international relations and community development, and may not be current or former Rotary members.

For women

Applicants must have earned the equivalent of a U.S. bachelor's degree and must have applied to their proposed institutions of study by the time of the application. Up to five fellowships are renewable for a second year. Recipients are selected for academic achievement and demonstrated commitment to women and girls. Recipients return to their home countries to become leaders in business, government, academia, community activism, the arts, and sciences.

Who may apply: Women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents.

Dorothy Marchus Senesh Fellowship

This fund provides a biennial fellowship awarded to a woman from the developing world for studies in fields of peace and development.

Margaret McNamara Memorial Fund

Awarded to women currently enrolled in an accredited U.S. or Canadian educational institution for the current year and who intend to be enrolled for the coming academic year, who have a record of service to women and children, and a commitment to improve the lives of women and children in developing countries. Application cycle is open from September 15 – January 15.

Who may apply: Applicants must be from a lower- or middle-class income developing member country, as designated on the organization's website. Applicants also must intend to return home or to another developing country within two years of completing a program and perform at least two years of service.

P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund

Scholarship is based on financial need and does not cover entire cost of tuition. Amount awarded up to \$12,500. Application deadline is December. Recipients are expected to maintain a relationship with the local P.E.O. chapter.

Who may apply: Women who are not U.S. citizens or permanent residents.
