

Eastern Mennonite University is eager to facilitate the transfer of students from BRCC to EMU as they pursue their educational goals.

A Guaranteed Admission Agreement student who meets EMU's transfer admission requirements and who completes all requirements for an Associate of Arts & Sciences degree in the BRCC College/University Transfer program may enroll at EMU and may expect the following:

1. EMU will guarantee the acceptance of transferable credits (up to a maximum of 65) earned through the College/University Transfer program. EMU cannot guarantee the student will be able to complete all degree requirements within the 128-credit minimum required for graduation at EMU. The student will be informed by EMU at the time an official credit evaluation is prepared if requirements will require credits beyond 128.

2. Acceptance in some programs at EMU is competitive; acceptance by EMU does not imply admission to these programs without further acceptance by the program. Students participating in this admission agreement should follow all special departmental/program application procedures and deadlines, noting required grade point averages and/or minimum grades required for specific courses.

3. Completion of the Associate in Arts & Sciences degree will satisfy all general education requirements at EMU except the following:

- one Bible/Religion course from a category designated "Anabaptist Biblical Perspectives" (three credits).

- the nine-credit cross-cultural requirement. This includes completion of a cross-cultural experience of at least three credits. When the experience results in fewer than the total requirement of nine credits, the remaining credits may be completed by transferring appropriate courses from BRCC one of which is a foreign language.
