In so doing, the Festival highlights the relevance, impact, and interdisciplinary richness of research from our liberal arts fields - from the humanities, fine arts, social sciences, and STEM disciplines.

## The ACE Festival aims to:

- Celebrate work across all disciplines at EMU
- Showcase student achievements in our best academic practices at EMU, including
  - Innovative and Applied Learning: creation of new knowledge and problem-solving through disciplinary knowledge
  - Creative expression through the arts
  - The praxis of our Anabaptist values of community, service to others, sustainability, peacemaking and discipleship
- Equip students with skills to prepare for career success:
  - Communication: presenting or participating in a professional conference
  - o Reflective Collaboration: working collaboratively with others
  - Integrative Learning: working across interdisciplinary lines to communicate ideas and provide feedback
- Facilitate mentorship of student scholars and artists by faculty members
- Engage themes related to our Common Read selection, which are rooted in the Anabaptist values listed above, and further explored in EMU Core values learning outcomes: Power & Equity, Environmental Sustainability, Intercultural Understanding, and Faith & Meaning.
- Provide a quality academic conference experience accessible to all students.
- Encourage greater attendance and visibility at scholarly events by consolidating them into a specific period of time

- A day-long schedule of events showcasing EMU students' and faculty's academic and creative excellence
- Engagement with a keynote speaker (selected by the Intellectual Life Committee, in conjunction with the Common Read selection)
- Additional showcase events the same week, hosted by EMU academic programs
