*Specific EMU pre-requisite nursing courses must be passed with a C or better; no more than two pre-requisite courses may be repeated; a single pre-requisite may not be repeated more than once; prerequisite courses must have been completed in the past 10 years.

ADVISING NOTES

Application process and materials:

- You must first be admitted to the University before the nursing program will consider your nursing application.
- ▶ Submit the EMU Transfer Application
- Request official high school transcript
- Request official college transcript(s) from each college/university attended.
- Submit Clinical Nursing Application (includes a onetime, non-refundable \$100 application fee).
 - Application deadlines for the fall semester is February 15 with final decision of admissions by March 30.
 - Application deadlines for the spring semester is June 15 with final decision of admissions by July 30.

Admission to the clinical nursing program is competitive with 24 admitted students during each fall and spring semester.

Students must maintain at least a 2.8 cumulative GPA to be considered for admission to the clinical nursing program..

Beginning fall 2019, students are required to complete and pass the Kaplan Nursing Entrance Exam prior to application.

Students who wish to transfer before completing the transfer program may apply to complete their remaining general education requirements/pre requisites courses at EMU while waiting to apply/begin the nursing program. Students who choose this path should meet with an EMU transfer counselor.
