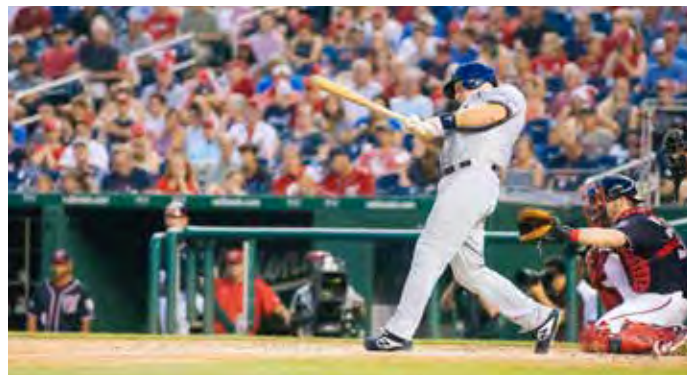

First things first, we recommend that all students file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to access all potential aid. You may complete the FAFSA any time after October 1.

BASIC COMPONENTS OF YOUR FINANCIAL AID PACKAGE

Scholarships

These scholarships are the most important part of the financial aid package and are determined by a student’s cumulative high school GPA and the highest SAT combined score or ACT composite score. These scholarships can be upgraded through January of the student’s senior year.

These scholarships are renewable up to five years as long as you maintain a GPA above 2.0.

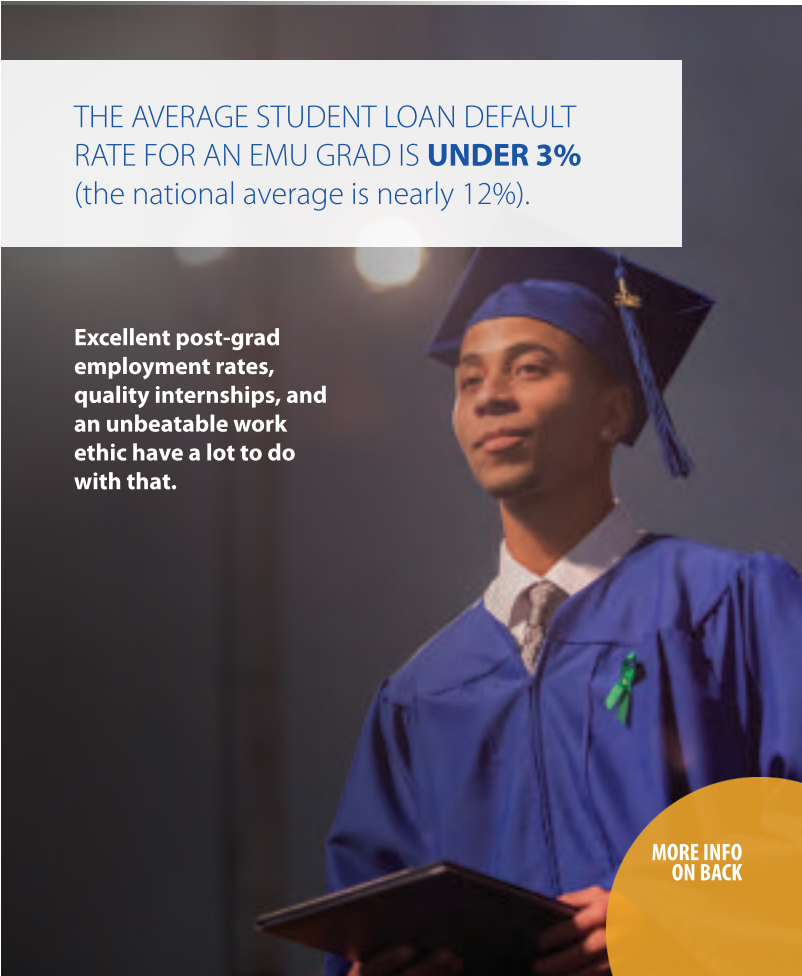

FEDERAL AND STATE GRANTS (GIFT AID)

VTAG: All Virginia residents receive the Virginia Tuition Assistance Grant (VTAG), which is estimated at \$3,400 each year.

GI Bill and Yellow Ribbon Program: EMU participates in the GI Bill and Yellow Ribbon Program. Contact your VA to find out what benefits you are able to apply to your education.

Federal Grants: Your FAFSA information may unlock need-based grants and loans. Our professionally trained staff are on hand to explain what each item means.

Make sure you go through the financial aid process. Award letters are sent in the early spring semester and the cost of an EMU education usually compares favorably to that of large public universities.

DID YOU KNOW

- ▶ **The biochemistry program** has joined the ranks of a select group accredited by the American Society for Biochemistry and Molecular Biology (ASBMB). Nationally, fewer than 75 colleges and universities have this accreditation, including only five others in Virginia.
- ▶ **The visual and communication arts (VACA) program** offers one of two nationally recognized conservation photography courses (the other is taught at Stanford). EMU students earned prestigious North American Nature Photography Association College Scholars Awards in 2015, 2017, and 2019. VACA students have launched careers at Facebook, National Geographic, and Rosetta Stone to name but a few organizations.
- ▶ **EMU's cross-cultural program** — a graduation requirement for more than 40 years — ranked #13 nationally as a top college to study abroad. Faculty have introduced students to cultural learning through educational travel in more than 80 locations around the globe.
- ▶ **Student-athletes** compete at the NCAA Division III level in the competitive Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). Athletes and whole teams are regularly recognized for outstanding academic success.
- ▶ **The Suter Science Center's new engineering labs** provide teaching and research space for the growing program and its award-winning students.
- ▶ **EMU is the first university in Virginia to build a microgrid** to power the campus independently of the local utilities if needed. LEED-certified residence halls and other energy-efficient buildings continue to place EMU among the top schools nationally in energy efficiency.
- ▶ **EMU is one of the only small liberal arts schools with an internship program in Washington, DC** that is supported by DC-based EMU faculty and a bricks-and-mortar facility.
- ▶ **An EMU team placed second out of 62 teams in an international cryptanalysis competition** and one of only 15 teams to achieve Master Codebreaker status.

CASAS, a 12-week summer program based in Guatemala City, offers students an independent summer immersion experience. Coursework includes Spanish language studies, Introduction to Central America, and elective courses chosen from religion, anthropology, sociology, and peace studies. Students participate in orientation activities, home stays, internships, and numerous field excursions. Application materials and information are available online. Short-term Spanish study is also available. Students register through EMU with approval from Intercultural Programs.

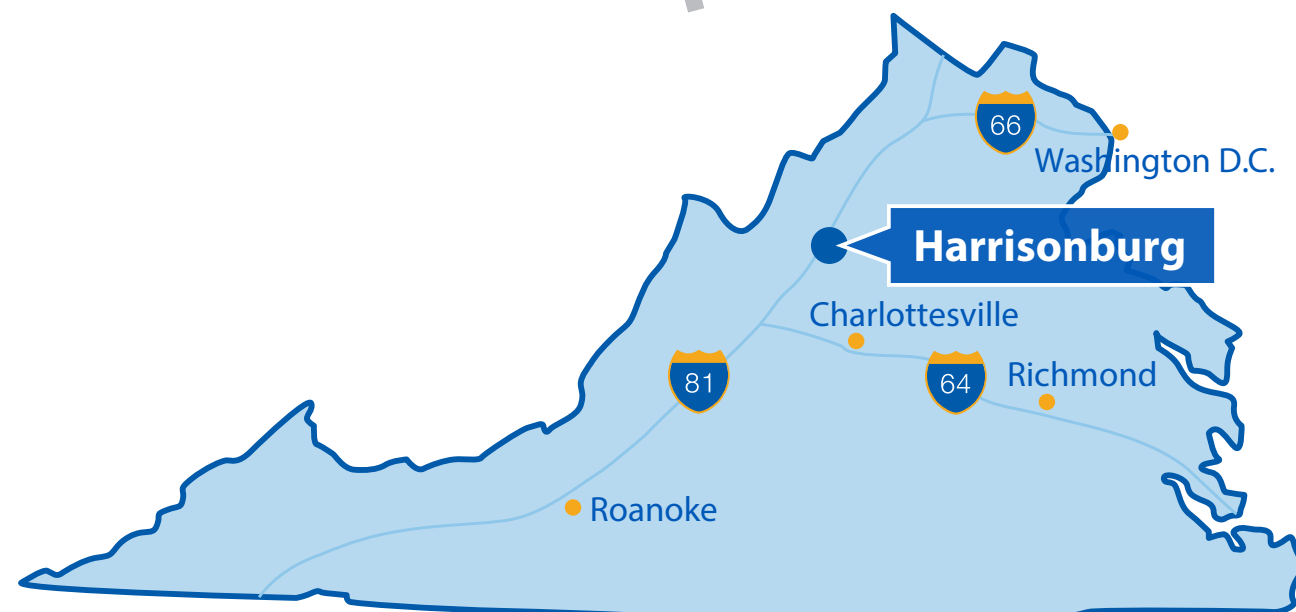
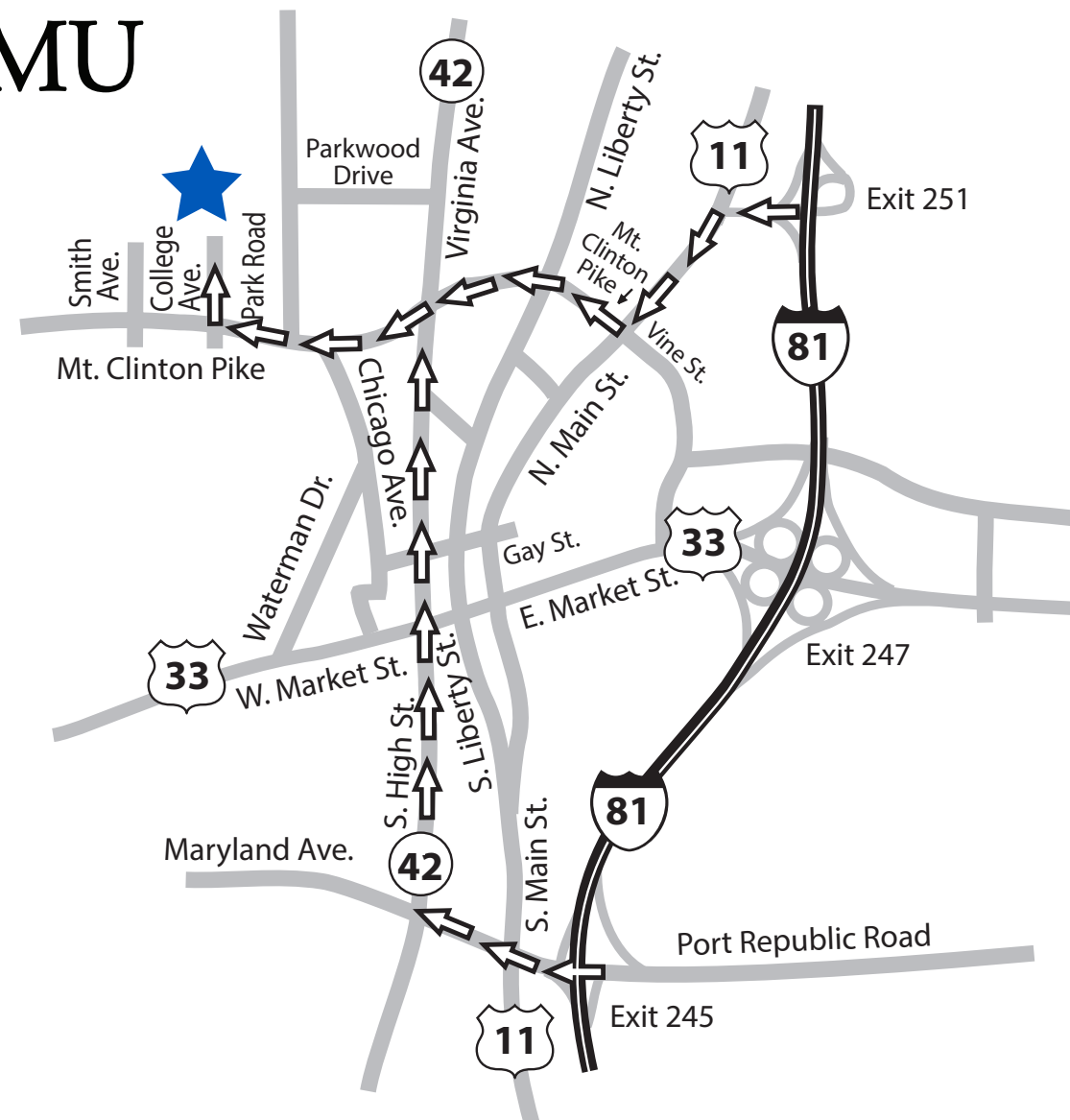

Directions to EMU

From the South

(Richmond, Roanoke, Blacksburg, Staunton and Tidewater):

Interstate 81 north to exit 245, the Port Republic Road exit. At the stop light, turn left on to Port Republic Road. Go approximately one mile to Route 42. At the stop light, turn right on to Route 42 (South High Street). Follow Route 42 north for two miles and turn left onto Mt. Clinton Pike (Rite Aid on right, BB&T Bank on left). Continue ½ mile to EMU sign, campus is on the right. Turn right on College Avenue. Look for signs to the Campus Center.

From the North

(Winchester, Washington D.C., Maryland and Pennsylvania):

Interstate 81 south to exit 251. At the stop sign, turn left (Route 11 south). Go approximately two miles to the stop light, turn right onto Mt. Clinton Pike. Continue approximately two miles to Route 42. At the traffic light (Mt. Clinton Pike/Route 42 intersection), continue for ½ mile to EMU sign, campus is on the right. Turn right on College Avenue. Look for signs to the Campus Center

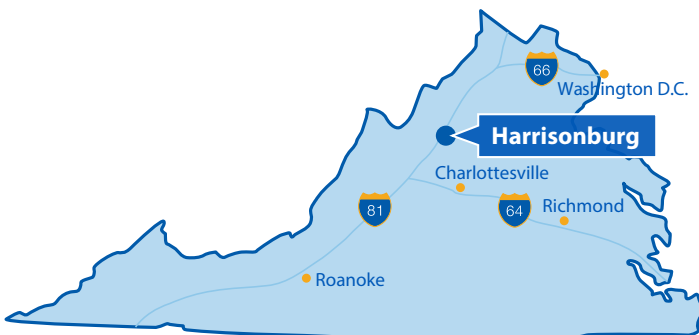
