IMPORTANT TESTING INFORMATION

The Virginia Department of Education requires multiple standardized tests for licensure. For admission to Teacher Education you must submit passing scores on the basic skills assessment (Praxis I, VCLA & Praxis I math, or SAT/ACT). For more information on testing and admission requirements see the Education Department home page: www.emu.edu/education

Remember that you must meet the basic skills assessment in order to be admitted to Teacher Education which is a prerequisite for registering for Literacy Block, Special Methods, or PE Block

Virginia Communication & Literacy Assessment (VCLA)

As of January 2007, the VCLA has become a licensure requirement of the Virginia Department of Education. **For all teacher education candidates**, passing scores on the VCLA is required for admission into the program. More information at: www.va.nesinc.com.

Virginia Reading Assessment (VRA)

The VRA is a graduation requirement for teacher education candidates who are specializing in **Elementary Education: PreK-3, PreK-6, and Special Education PreK-12**. It is recommended that students take this test while in Literacy Block, but it must be completed prior to student teaching semester. More information at: www.va.nesinc.com.

Praxis II

Praxis II Subject Assessments measure specific subject area content knowledge. Praxis II is a graduation requirement **for all teacher education candidates** and must be taken prior to the student teaching semester.
