Greetings faculty, staff and students,

Now that there is a confirmed COVID-19 case in Harrisonburg, our situation has changed in ways that will affect students, faculty and staff.

FOR RESIDENTIAL STUDENTS

With this changing situation, the decision to leave campus may be best. If you choose to leave, please notify residence life staff with this form and plan to remain at home until April 3.

We will allow students to remain on campus who feel that their health and wellbeing may be better maintained here.

For those students who choose to remain on campus, most facilities remain open, including student support services, academic resources, residence and dining facilities, and athletic facilities.

Prorated room & board refunds or credits will be calculated for students who move off campus during this period. The calculation will be determined towards the end of the semester when we can make those decisions.

University-Related Travel Policy

All non-essential university-related travel is suspended. Contact your supervisor if you have questions about what is considered non-essential.

Monitoring of Non-Essential Personnel and Visitors on Campus

Faculty and staff should consider if their campus visitor is a necessity before April 3. All non-essential personnel and visitors to campus are required to self-register.
