Instructions for IRS Data Retrieval, IRS Non-Filing Letter

IRS Data Retrieval (through FAFSA)

1. Go to FAFSA.gov, log in to the student's 2022-23 FAFSA record.
2. Select "Make FAFSA Corrections."
3. Navigate to the Financial Information section of the form.
4. Follow the instructions to determine if the student and/or parent(s) is eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2020 IRS income tax information into the student's FAFSA record.
5. Scroll through the remainder of the record to the end of the application, sign and submit.

Ordering IRS Non-Filing Letter

Student and or student's spouse who did not file a 2020 tax return are required to obtain a letter from the IRS to verify a federal income tax return was not filed.

1. Complete the enclosed 4506-T form
2. Provide information for items 1-4
3. Sign and date; be sure to include the telephone number of the non-filer
4. Mail or scan & email the completed 4506-T to EMU financial assistance office (finaid@emu.edu).
The financial assistance office will forward the request form to the IRS.
