QUALIFICATIONS:

Education: Unit 1 Suzuki teacher training is preferred before starting to teach. A Bachelor's Degree in Music and teaching experience is also preferred.

Special skills: Teach private and group Suzuki lessons at beginning and intermediate levels, August through May. Participate in student recitals, concerts and outreach performances (e.g. nursing homes). A qualified candidate may also be hired to teach University cello students during EMU's school year. Summer teaching is optional.
