Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) is a faith-based relief and development organization with community partners in many countries. This virtual internship opportunity with MCC introduces students to applied global public health and the systemic injustices underlying health inequities. The program includes:

- Instruction by MCC Global Health Coordinator Paul Shetler Fast connecting case studies in clean water and sanitation, maternal and child health and mental health to MCC project staff in Nepal, Zimbabwe, Haiti and the US/Canada.
- Team projects focused on maternal and child health issues with MCC partners in Kenya, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Ethiopia, Somaliland, and Nigeria
- Studying with a diverse global cohort of students from MCC and Mennonite colleges.
- Focusing on social determinants and colonial legacies of health, mental health, criminal justice and community-led disease prevention strategies.
- Learning applied skills in program monitoring and evaluation, quantitative and qualitative research and cross-cultural engagement.
- Coaching, mentoring and networking for careers in global public health.
