

# Transfer from HACC to EMU at Lancaster for seamless transition to the RN to BS in Nursing program.



- All 68 credits of the HACC ASN transfer to EMU at Lancaster
- EMU requires eight (8) gen eds as part of the 120-credit bachelor's degree - seven (7) of these are already built into the HACC ASN program of study!

## HOW DO YOU ACHIEVE THE 120 CREDITS FOR THE BS IN NURSING?

To be considered for admission to the RN to BS in nursing degree program a student must satisfy the following requirements:

- 68 ASN credits transferred + 43 credits of EMU nursing courses + 3 credits of history or literature = 114
- Add 6 additional hours of any other credit from accredited schools or colleges as electives (or take them during your RN-BS program)
- **TOTAL = 120**
