Clinical Nursing Admission Requirements

Admission to the clinical nursing is contingent upon the following:

- 1. Being at least 18 years of age
- 2. Obtaining a C or above in all prerequisite courses
- 3. Having a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 at the time of application to the clinical nursing prgram. A 2.8 cumulative GPA must be maintained to enter the clinical nursing program.
- 4. Admission to the clinical nursing program is subject to approval by the nursing department's admissions committee. Application deadlines: February 15 for fall admission; June 15 for spring admission
