Clinical Nursing Admission Requirements

Public Communication

Admission to the clinical nursing program is contingent upon the following:

Descriptive Statistics (or another Stats class)

- 1. Being at least 18 years of age
- 2. Having completed 58 semester hours (that meet the EMU CORE requirements) prior to beginning the clinical nursing program, unless completing a semester long intercultural while in the clinical nursing program.

2 credit hours 2 credit hours

- 3. Obtaining a C or above in all prerequisite courses
- 4. Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 at the time of application to the clinical nursing program. A 2.8 cumulative GPA must be maintained to enter the clinical nursing program.
- 5. Passing the Kaplan Admissions test. See www.emu.edu/nursing/admissions-test for more information.
- 6. Students entering EMU directly after high school with significant college credit must complete a minimum of one full-time semester at EMU prior to entering the clinical nursing program. These students may apply to the clinical nursing program prior to entering EMU if they have met all admission criteria.
- 7. Admission to the clinical nursing program is subject to approval by the nursing department's admissions committee. Application deadlines: February 15 for fall admission; June 15 for spring admission
