## Pediatric Behavioral Health: Strategy to Improve Access and Care

It is estimated that in the United States, one in six children ages 6 to 17 years suffers from a mental health disorder, and almost 50% of those with a mental health disorder do not receive treatment. Behavioral and mental health disorders have an impact not only on the child but also on the family, community, and society. Access to behavioral health care for children, youth, and their families is challenging as many barriers exist. This presentation will describe one children's hospital's strategy to improve access and care.

Anne Brenneman is an accomplished healthcare leader in pediatrics. She is currently the Director of the University Health Center at James Madison University.
