DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

THU 09 MAY Departure

Meet at Washington Dulles Airport for departure on your overnight flight to Vienna via Austrian Airlines. (Meals in-flight)

FRI 10 MAY Arrive Jerusalem

Connect in Vienna today and continue to Tel Aviv. Upon mid-afternoon arrival meet your guide and coach for the transfer to Jerusalem for hotel check-in and overnight. St. Mark's Lutheran Guesthouse (Meals in-flight, D)

SAT 11 MAY Jerusalem

Embark on a walking tour of the Christian Quarter, the Armenian Quarter and Mt. Zion in the Old City including a conversation with the Archimandrite of the Melchite Church. See the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and the Coptic Monastery on the roof. Visit the Dormitian Church and the Cenacle (Upper Room) before visiting the model of Jerusalem from the 2nd Temple Period at the Israel Museum. Continue to Tantur Ecumenical Institute for time to stroll in the gardens before prayers in the chapel and dinner in the Tantur dining room. Hear from Tantur's Rector, Fr. Russ McDougall, regarding Middle East Churches. St. Mark's Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

SUN 12 MAY Jerusalem/Bethlehem

This morning worship at the Melchite (Greek Catholic) Church in Jerusalem and join in People to People conversation with members of the congregation. After lunch on own in the Old City, enjoy a free afternoon in the Old City before departing for Bethlehem. Check in at the guesthouse followed by evening prayers, dinner and a free evening. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

MON 13 MAY Bethlehem

Today tour Bethlehem: Manger Square, Church of the Nativity, St. Catherine's, Herodion, Solomon's Pools and Shepherds' Fields (time for reflection). This evening is free after prayers and dinner. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, L, D)

TUE 14 MAY Bethlehem

This morning visit Dheisheh Refugee Camp where Palestinians have been living since 1948. People to People Conversations with residents. Visit Dar Al Kalima University for People to People Conversation with the Dean and university students. Then

visit Hope School in Beit Jala for a People to People Conversation with its principal and lunch at the school. Back at Manger Square, visit the Mosque of Omar for People to People Conversation with the Mufti on Muslim spirituality and prayer. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, L, D)

WED 15 MAY Jerusalem/Bethlehem

Walking tour explorations of Jerusalem's Old City continue today: the Haram al Sharif with Dome of the Rock, and Al Aqsa Mosque (no inside visits allowed), Western Wall, Southern Steps and Herodian excavations. Enjoy lunch on own: Middle Eastern fast food. Return to Mt. Zion to visit St. Peter in Gallicantu with time for reflection. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

THU 16 MAY Jerusalem/Bethlehem

This morning begin outside of the Old City walls at the Mount of Olives: Church of the Ascension, Pater Noster, Dominus Fleuit, Jewish Cemetery, Church of All Nations and the Garden of Gethsemane. Continue across the Kidron Valley past the Muslim Cemetery and through the Lion's Gate to St. Anne's and Pool of Bethesda. From here begin a walk along the Via Dolorosa. End the afternoon with reflection and communion in the peaceful surroundings of the Garden Tomb. Return to Bethlehem for evening prayers, dinner and an open evening. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

FRI 17 MAY Jaffa, Jerusalem/Bethlehem

This morning visit Immanuel House in Jaffa for a People to People exchange with Pastor David Lazarus about Messianic Jewish believers. Tour some of the historic sites of Jaffa. Continue to Jerusalem and Sabeel Ecumenical Liberation Theology Center for People to People Conversation regarding Palestinian Liberation Theology. This evening The Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb will discuss Contextual Theology with the group (subject to his availability). Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, L, D)

SAT 18 MAY Wadi Qilt, Dead Sea/Bethlehem

Today join a memorable trek down the Wadi Qilt to St. George's Monastery. After completing the trek, visit the "Zacchaeus" sycamore tree in Jericho and Qumran where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. Then float in the briny waters of the Dead Sea, the lowest spot on earth, before heading home. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

SUN 19 MAY Bethlehem

Begin the day with worship at Evangelical Lutheran Christmas Church and People to People Conversations with members of the congregation. The afternoon is free for individual pursuits. A walking tour to Majdi Ata Amro's shop will be available for those interested. Prayers followed by dinner and a free evening. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, D)

MON 20 MAY Bethlehem

Meet Zoughbi Zoughbi, Director of the Wi'am Palestinian Conflict Resolution Center. Then hear about Christian Zionism at Bethlehem Bible College and eat lunch on campus. Walk through a checkpoint between Bethlehem and Jerusalem. Meet with local representatives of the Mennonite Central Committee to discuss their work in Israel/Palestine and learn about the impact of the Separation Wall. The evening is free. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, L, D)

TUE 21 MAY Hebron/Bethlehem

Begin the day at Efrat Settlement for a conversation with a resident to gain a perspective on Israeli settlements. Visit the Palestinian village of At Tuwani and enjoy a lunch prepared by the women of the community. Travel to Hebron and visit Il Ibrahim Mosque. Then meet with members of the Christian Peacemaking Team for a walking tour of Hebron. Return to Bethlehem for prayers and dinner. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, L, D)

WED 22 MAY Masada Beersheba/Bethlehem

Travel to Masada and tour the mountaintop site where the Zealots made their last stand against the Romans. Continue into the Negev desert for a camel ride and a noon meal in a Bedouin tent. Visit Tel Beersheba and stop for reflection at Abraham's Well. Tonight after prayers and dinner, have a People to People Conversation with Salim Munayer on Musalaha (Reconciliation) and camel treks. Abu Gubran Lutheran Guesthouse (B, L, D)

THU 23 MAY Bethlehem/Beit Sahour

The morning is devoted to a work project at the Nassar family farm in the West Bank. Meet with Daher, the farmer of the farm, who will address issues of Palestinian landowners. After lunch at the farm return to Bethlehem for a free afternoon to pack for departure. In the late afternoon meet your homestay hosts for dinner and overnight in Beit Sahour. Homestays (B, L, D)

FRI 24 MAY Beit Sahour/Jerusalem

Reconvene and drive to Yad Vashem Holocaust Museum. Meet with Rabbi Yehiel Grenimann from Rabbis for Human Rights to learn about Jewish spirituality. Later this afternoon gather for a People to People Conversation with Jared Goldfarb to prepare for Shabbat and Jewish worship. The group will attend Kol HaNeshama Synagogue for a Shabbat service followed by a Shabbat meal. Paulus Haus (B, D)

SAT 25 MAY Jerusalem/Nazareth

Journey to Ramallah for a People to People Conversation at the Friends International Center. Drive to Taybeh to visit the Parable House at the Latin Catholic Church and visit with Abuna Aziz, the parish priest. Tour the "peace lamp" factory and see ruins of an ancient church. In Nablus visit Jacob's Well before continuing to Nazareth for check-in, prayers, dinner and a free evening. Betharam or St. Margaret's Guesthouse (B, L, D)

SUN 26 MAY Nazareth

This morning gather for worship at Christ Church Episcopal followed by a People to People Conversation with members of the congregation. After

lunch on own in downtown Nazareth, travel to the Cliffs of Arbel for a breathtaking first glimpse of the Sea of Galilee. Then to Mt. Tabor, the Mt. of Transfiguration, for reflection and a magnificent panoramic view. This evening meet with Fr. Nael Abu Rahmoun, who ministers to Arab Christians at the church we attended this morning. Betharam or St. Margaret's Guesthouse (B, D)

MON 27 MAY Nazareth

Start with a walking tour of Nazareth: Mary's Well, the Greek Catholic Synagogue Church (with time for reflection), Church of the Annunciation, and St. Joseph's Church. Visit Nazareth Village which is an authentic first century village and farm. Enjoy a lunch of first century foods followed by a tour of the village. Betharam or St. Margaret's Guesthouse (B, L, D)

TUE 28 MAY Nazareth/Tiberias

Begin the day with a visit to ancient Sepphoris then drive to Kibbutz Lavi for a People to People Conversation with Mordechai about Jewish Faith in 21st Century Israel. After lunch at the kibbutz, see the first century boat raised from the muddy lake bottom. End the day with a peaceful sail upon the waters of the Galilee. Proceed to your lodging for check-in followed by prayers, then dinner and a free evening. Franciscan Sisters Guesthouse Mount of Beatitudes (B, L, D)

WED 29 MAY Western Galilee

Tour the environs of the Sea of Galilee: explore Mt. of Beatitudes, the Primacy of Peter, Tabgha/Hep-tapegon (Church of the Multiplication), Chorazin, and Capernaum with time for reflection throughout. Meet for evening prayers before dinner and a free evening. Franciscan Sisters Guesthouse Mount of Beatitudes (B, L, D)

Our last day! Gather for the Closing Retreat and Communion Service this morning, then a St. Peter's Fish Lunch. Depart for the Mediterranean coast and the site of Caesarea Maritima, once the Roman capital of Palestine. See the Roman aqueduct and walk along the beach. Continue to Jerusalem for hotel check-in and a final dinner. Paulus Haus (B, L, D)

SAT 01 JUN

Return to U.S.A.

Transfer early this morning to Ben Gurion Airport for flight check-in and departure. Arrive home this same day enriched with your many discoveries of Places, People and Prayers in the Holy Land. (B, meals in-flight)

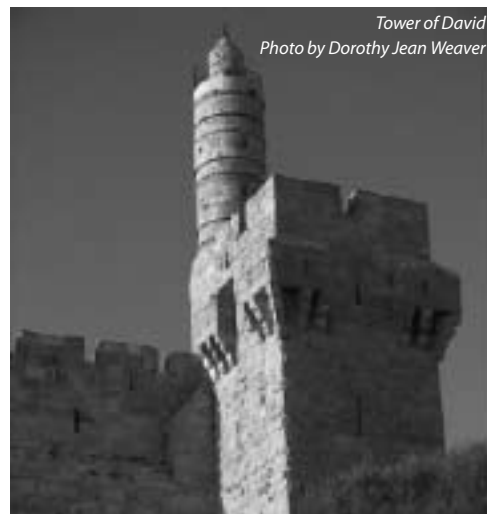
