The library website (<https://emu.edu/library/>) is the starting point for access to library resources. You will find access to books ebooks, journals and streaming videos here.

The Peacebuilding and Conflict Studies guide (<http://libguides.emu.edu/peacebuilding>) provides access to specific resources for this area of study. Included here you will find electronic access to many of the “Little Book” series. Look for the “Little Books” tab.

For local students, the library is open with limited hours. Check the library website to see when we are open. <https://emu.edu/library/hours> Please show your EMU ID to the person at the desk and always wear a mask in the building.

### **SPI participants taking courses for credit**

For SPI participants finishing their course work away from EMU, and who will not have physical access to the Hartzler Library, the library provides these services:

- access to library research databases for SPI students is through their EMU email address and password;
- students will find a wide variety of online resources, including ebooks, journal articles and streaming films available via the library website;
- all request for resources not owned by EMU or in print should be made through EMUshare which is accessed through the library website. Use your full email address and password to login.
- the library can scan and send via email journal articles and book chapters from print materials. If students require complete books we can mail items to you but we may not send heavily used items.; Due to a student’s location mailing materials may not be possible and staff will work with the student to figure out alternatives;
- interlibrary loan services provide students access to resources not owned by EMU. When full-text is not available most citations will have a “Request through Interlibrary Loan” option;
- students are encouraged to make use of libraries in their home areas if they have collections and resources which are helpful;
- students are welcome to contact the library staff if they have questions or need assistance.

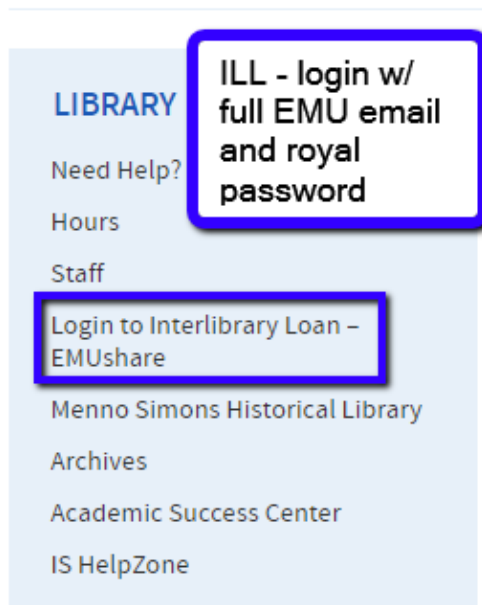
